HT 356W Teaching Luther's Small Catechism

COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this seminar, participants will explore the theology of the Small Catechism, engage it as teachers, and develop resources for using the catechism in congregational settings.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To grow in knowledge and faith through the study of the Small Catechims
- 2. To study and use the Small Catechism as a resource for personal and congregational growth
- 3. To learn and develop strategies for teaching the Small Catechism

PROCEDURES & EVALUATION

The course will use a seminar format, largely revolving around in-class discussion of assigned readings and reflection upon personal experiences with the Small Catechism. Asynchronous students will be responsible for engaging the themes in online discussions. Students will write and share two papers/projects throughout the semester.
