### HT205W Global Church in Motion 2

3 credits. Course may be taken synchronously or asynchronously; letter or credit/no credit.

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

A continuation of HT 105, this course examines global Christian witness and mission over the past 500 years. Careful attention will be given to the diversity of church communities during and after the Reformation, the impact of factors like colonialism, industrialism, rationalism, and fundamentalism on religious life, and the efforts of Christians—including Lutherans in North America and around the world—to address complex issues of identity and change.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To listen to and learn from Christians who came before us
- 2. To discern the Holy Spirit's activity by studying missio dei across time
- 3. To develop and articulate a gospel-centered (evangelical) theology of mission
- 4. To gain familiarity with North American and global Lutheran histories
