

IN243W 21st Century Leadership: Public, Connected, and Adaptive

Required, MDiv and MA in Diaconal Ministry students (typically 2nd-year). Two semester hours.

DESCRIPTION:

Students in this course will be equipped to see themselves as servant leaders in relation to the Gospel, other individuals, the faith community, and the wider public. This course cultivates personal leadership skills, capacities, and assets for leadership.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To articulate from a Christian theological perspective, leadership as gospel centered and publicly oriented.
2. To integrate one's own vision for public Christian leadership in light of the Triune God's mission in and through congregations and communities (agencies, organizations, and institutions).
3. To identify, affirm, and further develop one's gifts and skills for ministry, and empower others to identify, affirm, and develop their own skills and gifts for ministry.

SEMINARY OUTCOMES:

- Interprets reality and relationships in biblically and theologically resonant ways.
- Leads with confidence and fosters team building, collegiality, and mutual edification.
- Builds respectful connections with ecclesial, interreligious and secular partners.

PROCEDURE:

A combination of lecture, class discussion, assigned reading, and personal reflection will guide our shared learning. Regular attendance and active participation in all class work is expected.

EVALUATION:

Students will be evaluated on several short writing assignments and class participation.
