WTS courses marked with an asterisk (\*) have enrollment controls placed on them for the specific purpose of balancing registration between sections or between similar courses. These courses are usually for a targeted group of students to meet programmatic requirements, with outside registration possible only by permission of the instructor. The WTS Registrar reserves the right to shift a student to a different section of the same course or to a course that meets the same program requirement in order to meet this request for a balanced enrollment, and will make all efforts to work with the student to resolve conflicts as a result of this requirement.

Many WTS courses are restricted to only the Credit/NoCredit (i.e., pass/fail) grading option, and are so indicated by the ampersand (&) symbol next to the number of credits indicated for the course. Other courses may have a preferred grading plan (with an alternative option by permission of instructor). See the course descriptions for more information. **To take a credit/no-credit course for letter grade requires a Letter Grade Override permission form signed by the instructor.**

**NOTES:**

- MN 269W Topics in YCM: Practical Theology only **partially** fulfills (1 out of 3 credits) the M.Div. Pastoral Care requirement. Students will need to complete more credit of pastoral care coursework to fulfill the requirement for the degree.
- MN 387W Disabilities intensive only **partially** fulfills (1 out of 3 credits) the M.Div. Pastoral Care requirement. Students will need to complete more credit of pastoral care coursework to fulfill the requirement for the degree.
- MN 113W Applied Piano or Organ Lessons – involves extra instructor fees.
