These courses are usually for a targeted group of students to meet programmatic requirements, with outside registration possible only by permission of the instructor. The WTS Registrar reserves the right to shift a student to a different section of the same course or to a course that meets the same program requirement in order to meet this request for a balanced enrollment, and will make all efforts to work with the student to resolve conflicts as a result of this requirement.
- Many WTS courses have the preferred option of only the Credit/No-Credit (i.e., pass/fail) grade option, and are so indicated by the ampersand (&) symbol.
